-What is Comprehensive Planning?-

- +A planning process required by the Pennsylvania Department of Education.
 - An updated plan is submitted to PDE every three years.
- +A process to ensure that all students are achieving at high levels.
- +A process that helps school districts plan for continuous improvement.

Current Plan: July 1, 2018 through June 30, 2021

New Plan: July 1, 2021 through June 30, 2024

28 Day Public Review Period begins: Tuesday, October 12, 2021

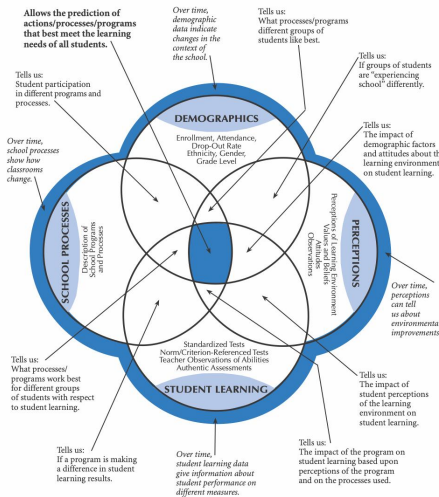

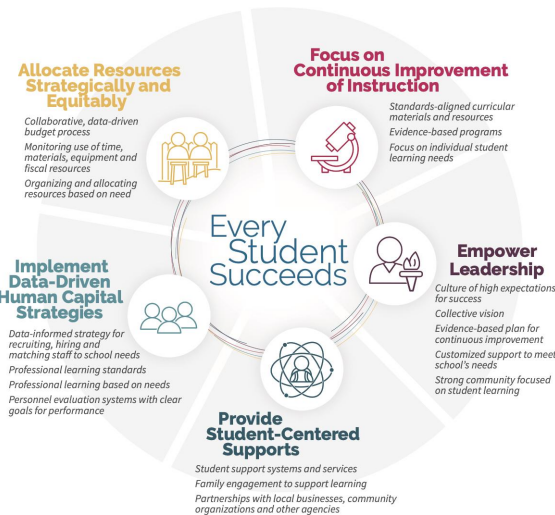

-Time Line-

- November 30th: Submit plan to PDE.
